¹ Certificate of Airworthiness: an individual Certificate of Airworthiness issued in accordance with or Annex 8 to the Convention on International Civil Aviation, signed on 7 December 1944 in Chicago ("ICAO compliant CofA"), or Commission Regulation (EU) No 748/2012 of 3 August 2012 laying down implementing rules for the airworthiness and environmental certification of aircraft and related products, parts and appliances, as well as for the certification of design and production organisations.

² Amateur built aircraft and historical aircraft (non-complex aircraft, originally factory-manufactured, previously holding an ICAO compliant CofA, with a maximum take-off weight of less than 5700 kg, whose initial design was established before 1 January 1955, and whose production has stopped before 1 January 1975) registered in an ECAC Member State are exempted to obtain a temporary permission to fly over Belgian territory. However, the use of these aircraft in Belgian airspace is limited to a maximum of 30 days per calendar year.

- a copy of the **Certificate of Registration** or the document taking the place thereof;
- a proof of compliance with **Regulation (EC) No. 785/2004** of the European Parliament and of the Council of 21 April 2004 on **insurance requirements** for air carriers and aircraft operators.
